

## Motion on Municipal Infrastructure Bonds in Ontario

February 9, 2024

## Mayor Rob Burton – Oakville

**WHEREAS**, the Housing Affordability Task Force (HATF) Recommendation #44 calls for collaboration with municipalities to develop a municipal services corporation utility model for water and wastewater, emphasizing borrowing and amortizing costs among customers instead of relying on development charges; and

**WHEREAS**, a Municipal Infrastructure Bond system address the challenges posed by HATF Recommendation #44 and ensures sustainable financing for water and wastewater municipal infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS,** Michael Fenn, a former Ontario Deputy Minister, supports tax-exempt municipal bonds as a welcome tool in the toolbox of local governments and as an alternative to relying on other orders of government for episodic and occasionally unreliable multi-year capital grant programs.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Ontario's Big City Mayors (OBCM) supports the Ontario Government's initiative to evaluate the viability of a tax-exempt municipal infrastructure bonds fiscal tool to be used as an additional funding tool for municipalities;

**AND THAT** OBCM engage and collaborate with relevant Ministries, including but not limited to Finance, Infrastructure and Municipal Affairs and Housing, on a potential tax-exempt municipal bond system.
